

USING THIS BOOK

Before you start your next round of golf take a moment to look through this yardage book. Pay attention to the hazards, playing tips, and basic yardage information to help yourself get a feel for the course. When you go to play each hole review the playing tip for helpful hints. Look for landmarks like trees, bunkers, or curves in the fairway to align your shots with. Reference the yardage measurements as a tool to help you decide which clubs will be best to use. As you play the hole, you can make notes on the pages of this book for yourself. Next time you come to play our course, you will have a personalized guide to playing your best.







The first hole is straight forward in direction but deviating from that line may leave you with some challenging approach shots. A miss to the right could lead to tree trouble and missing left could be flirting with the out of bounds. Aggressive or conservative approaches require accuracy to allow for an opening birdie.

The second hole is a deceivingly difficult par three requiring a long uphill carry to reach the putting surface. The large oak tree guards the green from the left while approaches from the right side can offer favourable bounces towards the pin. A shot too far past the hole provides for slippery putts towards the false front of the green.

The slight dog legged third hole requires a 200 yard tee shot for an opportunity to view this two-tiered green. Shot selection on your approach is important as landing on the wrong tier could lead to a putting fiasco. Be advised that misses to the left of the green past the bunker will guide the ball back towards the green while balls flared to the right are destined for the trap.

The fourth hole provides a varied challenge depending on the tee deck. From the top deck, it requires a solid strike to reach in regulation. Sand traps guard the green from the right while the safe bailout is just short and left of the green.

The fifth hole is a slight dogleg left that requires a precise tee shot to avoid tree trouble for your approach. The green is positioned such that pin locations in the middle or back of the green require well calculated distances to keep it close. A safe miss will always be short and left of the green.

The sixth hole is a blind tee shot into this dogleg right. Keep left of centre to ensure trees are not causing distress for your approach shot. Water protects the green on the front left corner while a bunker collects any shots that stray to the right. The right side of the green slopes off of the front and the back which could lead to a difficult up and down.

The seventh hole is signatured by "Charlie's Park" on the right. This dogleg left requires two skilled shots. The tee ball can hug the corner of the tree line for an optimal look at the middle of the fairway. The approach may require more club to the elevated, two-tiered green protected by bunkers should you leave it short.

The eighth hole is your first par five of the day. A solid strike from the tee makes all the difference on this hole. Too far to the right and you are fighting tree trouble to get back in play. The hole also features a gully from 150 yards in which can create challenging lies and yardage calculations. Safe approaches are to the right side of the green as the left is narrow and protected by bunkers.

The ninth hole is a challenging par 4. The big hitters will gain an immediate advantage if they can catch the downhill slope. The left side is tree-lined while a bunker and gully await on the right hand side. Leaving a ball short off the tee makes a green in regulation very difficult with bunkers protecting the green. Long left approaches are a safe play towards the hole as grass contours await greenside to collect shots.

The back 9 begins with a long, up hill, difficult par 4. A long tee shot that avoids the right fairway bunker increases the player's chances of hitting the green in regulation. On the approach, avoid going right, as the green is protected by some difficult bunkers, with out of bounds across the road. Any 4 is here is a good 4.

The eleventh is a straight forward, scoring opportunity early in the back 9. A generous landing area from the tee gives the player an opportunity to attack the pin from the fairway. There is out of bounds on the right, and bunkers protect the green on the left, but with two good shots, birdie opportunities await.

Perhaps the most difficult hole on the back 9. A left to right tee shot gives the player the best look at this difficult green. The green has two distinct tiers, and being on the right level is imperative. On your approach, the appropriate miss is short and left, as this gives the player a clear look at the entire green if a pitch is needed.

A good tee shot puts a short iron in the player's hands for their second shot. However, this green complex may be one of the narrowest surfaces on the course, so a high and soft approach is required. Both sides of this fairway are tree-lined, so hitting the fairway is important. Mounds and bunkers also protect the green, so distance control and accuracy are key.

There's nothing easy about the first par 3 on the back 9. An accurate tee shot that avoids the difficult bunkering short and left, and misses the bunkers and mounds long and right gives the player a chance at making 3. A back left pin requires a full carry, while a short right pin gives the player a chance to use the contours of the fairway to bounce one close. The player has many options from the tee, but accuracy is a must.

A long and straight par 5 becomes a scoring opportunity after a good tee shot. Hitting the fairway definitely gives the player an opportunity to go for the green in 2, however, tee shots that stray too far right or left may result in lay-ups. On the approach, avoid the mounds that surround the putting surface as they make pitch shots difficult. Two or three goods shots definitely provide the player with birdie opportunities here.

Another long par 4 awaits the player on sixteen. A tee shot that splits the rocks on both sides of the fairway offers the best look at the green for the approach. The right side of the hole is lined with red stakes, while mounds and bunkering protect the green on the left. Accuracy and distance control are imperative.

There is nothing easy about the par 3, seventeenth. A well protected green that slopes from back to front requires your full attention. Anything short will fall into the gulley below, resulting in a difficult uphill pitch shot. Tee shots that stray off-line could result in a variety of "interesting" scores on this closing par 3.





Eighteen



Bombs Away!! The eighteenth is an inviting closing par 5 that tempts the long hitter to go for the green in two. A long, straight tee shot creates a risk-reward scenario for the second. A well protected green, consisting of several levels, requires the player to think long and hard before selecting a club. Pin placement should also be a consideration when deciding what kind of approach shot you want to hit. Execution is key here for the player looking to end their round with a birdiel
